Introduction

The research and consulting centers within Libyan universities and the Academy of Graduate Studies play a fundamental role in advancing scientific research and addressing societal challenges, both in public and private sectors, as well as contributing to sustainable development. However, these centers face significant obstacles, including a lack of technical and artistic capabilities, as well as insufficient financial and logistical resources. In response to these challenges, the directors of the research and consulting centers have recognized the importance of collaboration to mitigate these difficulties. As a result, they have established a joint scientific cooperation agreement aimed at fostering communication and cooperation among the centers. This agreement is designed to enable researchers to maximize the existing resources within their institutions and to collaborate on robust scientific research across various fields that benefit the environment and society. Ultimately, this initiative seeks to enhance the global standing of Libyan universities and the Academy of Graduate Studies in international rankings.

Agreement objectives

- Encouraging collaborative efforts in research and consulting projects those align with national priorities.
- Enhancing the research skills and capabilities of faculty members and students.
- Offering practical solutions to societal and economic challenges.
- Fostering innovation by developing new technologies and methodologies that contribute to development.
- Addressing the gaps in the skills that researchers need to conduct robust research.

Terms of Agreement

(1)

Work together to promote cooperation in all areas of scientific research, in accordance with the laws in force in Libya.

(2)

Exchange scientific expertise, researchers, and other academic capabilities in the field of scientific and technical research, and will encourage visits between them.

(3)

Establishment of joint training programs across a range of fields, which will be determined and agreed upon by the parties involved in the future.

(4)

Assisting researchers in conducting their necessary studies and completing tasks in the laboratories associated with the parties of the agreement, based on available resources.

(5)

Organize conferences, workshops, and scientific seminars.

(6)

Provide consultations to both the private and public sectors.

(7)

The parties involved in the agreement will establish a mechanism to monitor its implementation. They will prepare annual progress reports to evaluate the

agreement during meetings that include the directors of the participating research and consulting centers.

(8)

This agreement will take effect from the signing date and remain in force for four years, in accordance with applicable regulations and laws.

(9)

This agreement will be automatically renewed unless one party notifies the other in writing of its intention not to renew at least six months before the expiration date. Neither party may amend any provision of this agreement without the approval of all parties involved.

(10)

If this agreement is canceled, the existing joint programs will continue until the work objectives are met.
